Freddie Alaniz is a violent criminal from the La Pryor, Texas area and has connections to George West and Beaumont, Texas, as well as Veracruz, Mexico.

On February 7, 2006, ALANIZ was arrested in Zavala County for Sexual Assault of a Child. While out on bail, he was arrested for

Aggravated Assault in San Antonio for stabbing a male victim during a fight. He again made bail and fled.

On May 16, 2006, the Zavala County Sheriff's Office issued a warrant for ALANIZ's arrest for Sexual Assault of a Child. On August 4, 2006, the Bexar County Sheriff's Office issued a warrant for Murder after ALANIZ's assault victim died as a result of his injuries. Caution: Subject should be considered ARMED and DANGEROUS!

2. Crime Update: Recent Burglaries Show Modest Reduction - Keep on your guard! - During the past month there were a total of 79 home Burglaries in the Sparta Valley area; that down from 122 during the month of June, '14.

Also in the news, a 37 y/o Waco man was arrested for suspicion of distribution of large amounts of cocaine in the Bell County.



Jesse Raul Garcia, charged on July 26, with possession of cocaine with intent to distribute and possession of a firearm by a felon, is being held at the Bell County Jail on a \$150,000 bond.

The Bell County Organized Crime Unit investigated Garcia, and seized more than \$25,000 worth of cocaine and a stolen handgun during their investigation.

Despite that, illegal drug-related crimes across the county increased by 24% in the past 12 months. The trend was not notable in the Sparta Valley area of concern.

3. Clear and Present Danger; Is the Illegal Alien Explosion Creating Higher Risk of Terrorism or of Pandemic? - Everyday that our boarder with Mexico is left unsecure, hundreds or more a day of illegals will keep pouring in. The probability is extremely high that many of them are members of known gangs, and many of them blend-in with their group, later to disappear within the cloak of a terrorist cell lying in wait for the opportunity to strike.

What we're force-fed by the news media about the thousands of unaccompanied children fleeing a third-world country because of the deplorable conditions they're escaping, is barely half the story.

Congressional members are being turned away from visiting the "detention" areas and border agents and medical personnel are intimidated to keeping quiet about the conditions.

The out-of-control surge of illegal immigration will create huge near and long-term risks to the health and welfare of our

communities, and overwhelm us financially for which we will sacrifice a great deal of our safety and security, our schools, healthcare and even our culture!

"Crime is off the chart in this state," says Pinal County Sheriff Paul Babeu, president of the Arizona Association of Sheriffs.

While the correlation between illegal immigrants and crime is almost impossible to quantify precisely, the available numbers indicate that Arizona -- as well as California and Texas -- are dealing with a disproportionately high number of criminals who are illegal immigrants.

Far from getting any assistance from the federal government, to deal with the problem southern states have had to pass their own immigration enforcement laws.

Apart from the obvious "immigration violations", many of the crimes are drug-related. Illegal immigrants and smuggling organizations have also been linked to some specific violent crimes like kidnapping. The records also show criminal offenses, which included murder, battery, rape, and nearly 3,000 thefts. Roughly two percent of the crimes included child molestation, lynching, and torture, according to the 13-page Congressional Research Service report.

Latest reports also indicate that assaults against U.S. law enforcement on the southwestern border are on the rise; indicating that the number of attacks, mostly related to immigrant smuggling, on Border Patrol agents increased by 46%.

Most recently in Arizona, Mexican Nationals armed and dressed in military uniforms caught crossing into the United States and then confronting U.S. Border Patrol agents, is becoming an issue of concern.

The men claimed to be with the Mexican Military's 80th Battalion, but the names they gave did not match the names on their uniforms. Some Mexican military personnel are known to be providing security for the cartel.

Incidents like this are not uncommon and have happened 23 times in Arizona.

Together, Arizona, California and Texas are home to 4.7 million of the 11 million illegal immigrants estimated to be in the country.

According to the United Nations, 97% of the illegal immigrants who enter the U.S. clandestinely do so across the almost 2,000-mile border between the U.S. and Mexico, but only 20 percent of those who cross the border illegally are caught.

The *New York Times* reports that about 4.5 million illegal aliens in the U.S. drive on a regular basis, many without licenses or insurance, or even the ability to read road signs written in English.

The Office of Immigration Statistics reported that of the 188,382 deportations of illegal aliens in 2011, 23% had committed criminal traffic offenses (primarily driving under the influence).

According to the Center for Immigration Studies, another 23%, more than 43,000 illegal aliens, were convicted of drug offenses.

The violent crime category of assault, robbery, sexual assault, and family offenses comes to 12%. The non-violent crime grouping of larceny, fraud, and burglary totaled 7%; equaling 100% of illegal aliens who have been through the criminal justice system and inflicted thousands to millions in cost per alien on the system, for issues having nothing to do with their illegal entry into the country.

In Arizona alone, marijuana seizures have spiked from a low in 2008 of about 19,600 pounds to over 45,500 pounds in 2010; and the amounts just keep increasing.

In Texas' southern federal court district this year, where nearly 90% of all new prosecutions were for illegal entry and reentry into the U.S., federal authorities are looking for more room to hold detainees, many of whom are charged with immigration crimes.

The Mexican drug cartels have almost toppled the Mexican Government and they are crossing into the U.S. at will. In Mexico, over 42,000 lives have been lost to their wars and that number is rising by the hour. Their illegal drug trade is a forty billion dollar a year industry. The stakes are so high and the competition so fierce, that Mexican warlords are sparing no expense.

Nationwide, the number of people prosecuted for coming back illegally after being deported has increased by 175 percent since 2005.

Federal statistics show the illegal immigrants made up a disproportionate share of the state prison populations in California and Arizona.

In Texas, the percentage was also slightly higher in the prisons than it was statewide. The undocumented residents surveyed, almost all of them had more than one arrest. They averaged about eight arrests per person. Nearly half of the offenses were for drug crimes or immigration violations.

The invasion of illegal aliens has established a bloody battlefield in the form of street gangs. What fuels the growth of gangs is money – easily obtainable via drug smuggling.

The National Gang Intelligence Center makes the connections between the Mexican drug cartels and various U.S.-based gangs, especially illegal alien rings such as Los Aztecas and MS-13.

Another rapidly expanding gang, Florencia

13, works closely with the Mexican Mafia and is based out of South Los Angeles. Florencia 13 is part of a terrifying gang war scene that has turned L.A. into one of the most dangerous counties in the country. It also has members and influence in states like Virginia and Iowa. The gang has racked up charges ranging from piracy to conspiracy to sell drugs and murder over the last few years. They also have been cited for infiltrating the U.S. military.

Originally based out of El Paso, Los Aztecas have become a powerful paramilitary force on both sides of the Mexico border. Now many of the gang's members are recruited from Texas prisons, and some of its work takes place inside prison walls, such as heroin production. Los Aztecas work with the Juarez and Los Zetas cartels running drugs, smuggling illegal aliens and murdering consulate officials.

The Southern States are favored destinations for Third World immigrants from Latin America. A new study published by the Migration Policy Institute and the Wilson Center sheds light on the passage of Central Americans through Mexico, in a phenomenon called "transmigration". Among the findings cited is the fact that arrests by the U.S. Border Patrol of individuals from countries other than Mexico (OTM), increased from 59,000 in FY 2010 to 99,000 in FY 2012.

Large families, combined with a continuous flow of hundreds of thousands of new immigrants, means that Latin American colonies are being established throughout the South and that native populations and culture are being displaced by the unchecked growth of the immigrants.

This growth spurt of ill nourished, impoverished, unskilled and uneducated demographic, has already in states like California, over-taxed our schools and medical facilities to the point of despair or dissolution.

The health concerns with hundreds of illegal immigrants crossing over into southern Texas, is growing.

This time the focus is not on the women and children that are crossing over in droves, the concern is about a viral outbreak.

Agents are seeing illegal immigrants come over with contagious infections. Detention centers and holding facilities have quarantined areas for those who come in sick who are separated from the health only by caution tape.

Scabies, a contagious skin infection, chicken pox, MRSA, staph infections and fevers of all contagions are just a few of the illness noted.

It's unclear how many were treated for illness because DHS has denied all requests for interviews with doctors and medical staff treating sick immigrants.

Yet, people are continually being transported

to different parts of the country.

What we are not being told is that sick and diseased immigrants are being placed in the general population of the U.S. The silence associated with DHS and HHS and what they are forcing the Border Patrol to do with these new immigrants is deafening.

The influx of detained undocumented immigrants pose a significant risk to the health of agents as well as national security as a whole.

Along these same lines, the CDC and HHS have tipped their hand and are plainly telling the American public what is coming and how we are all at risk.

Late last week, a busload of illegal immigrants pulled out of the Chula Vista checkpoint and onto a local San Diego freeway. There were two Border Patrol agents sitting behind the driver wearing surgical masks. A San Diego news vehicle tried to follow the bus onto the freeway, but Border Patrol SUVs blocked the entrance. It's been learned that 10 people were transported to local hospitals in the San Diego area for treatment of such announced maladies as scabies and head lice.

An American child, who is in the hospital to have their tonsils removed, along with his visiting parents, attending nurses and physicians, may unwittingly become carriers for a more serious illness with the potential to rip through the general population as a result of these irresponsible actions which are placing all of us at risk.

At Lackland AFB in San Antonio, TX., there are so many kids coming in that there is no way to control the sickness.

It has now been reported that the CDC is planning for mass casualties from infectious disease outbreak, natural disasters, or chemical, biological, or radiological nuclear events.

With regard to the infectious disease outbreaks, HHS and the CDC are a day late and a dollar short. The damage has already been done.
