**CCH:** Robbery, Burglary, Grand Theft Auto, Theft, Receiving Stolen Property, Resisting Officer, Escape, DWI, Dangerous Drugs, Possession of Narcotics Equipment, and Probation Violation **LKA:** 12781 Crisantemo, San Elizario, Texas Jose Angel **CABRAL** is affiliated with the Barrio Azteca gang and has an extensive Texas criminal history, including arrests for Robbery, Burglary, Theft, Resisting Officer, Escape, DWI, Possession of Narcotics Equipment, Dangerous Drugs, and Probation Violation. He also has a similar criminal history in California, with arrests for Grand Theft Auto, Theft, and Receiving Stolen Property.

On November 28, 1996, **CABRAL** was convicted of Robbery in El Paso and was sentenced to TDCJ in July 1997. He was paroled on November 25, 2009, and subsequently absconded.

On November 26, 2009, the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles issued a warrant for **CABRAL's** arrest for Parole Violation. He also has an active 1989 warrant for Burglary out of Culver City, California, but the warrant only authorizes limited extradition.

**CABRAL's** California criminal history indicates that he was deported to Mexico in May 1979. Federal records indicate that he is not legally in the US and appears to be subject to removal proceedings.

### 2. Crime Update - (Source: KXXV.Com)

**Killeen** - A man claiming to be a "close friend" of Major Nidal Hasan was arrested Friday after making a terroristic threat against his estranged wife and her friend.

A woman claiming her husband, Elsayed Elzarek Behairy had assaulted and threatened her life during a domestic dispute.

The couple had been separated for nearly two years.

Police records show the suspect told his wife he had been watching her and her 23-year-old male friend. He told the woman, she would never be able to marry anyone else.

Behairy stated: "I have enough money to hire someone to kill both of you. I'm like brother to Hasan, if someone embarrasses me and my religion, I will kill them."

This could have been an attempt to carry-out a so-called "honor" killing. Honor murders usually target women who are accused of dishonoring their families by being disobedient or unfaithful.

The wife told police she believes Behairy will kill her, and fears for her life. She said Behairy was, in fact, close friends with Hasan.

The charge of terroristic threat was filed against Mr. Behairy, was directly related to the family violence incident and had nothing to do with Behairy's relation to Hasan. In addition to charges of making a terroristic threat, Behairy is an illegal immigrant from Egypt.

### 3. Illegal Immigration Attributed to More Than Terrorist Threats And Job Losses:

What, do you suppose, is the next looming mass casualty event - an undeterred terrorist attack? How about a massive hurricane, wide-spread tornados, one or more earthquakes or some other natural disaster? You might be surprised, as I was to learn that there is a more insidious danger that is being totally overlooked by our Government and by the media headlines - Third World Diseases Making a Comeback in America!

We should all be aware by now of the pervasive nature of the West Nile virus - a mosquito borne disease for which there is no medical treatment or vaccine to prevent. Bell County alone has had 10 confirmed cases with one related fatality. But, there are a number of diseases brought into the country, mostly by illegal immigrants that were once thought to be unknown or eradicated in the U.S.

Except on reruns of "House", when was the last time you heard of any doctor utter the words, "You have Dengue fever"? Other deadly Third World diseases like tuberculosis, malaria, and leprosy are showing up, mostly in the Border States with Mexico, primarily by illegal immigrants. Cases of tuberculosis in El Paso are twice as high as the national average.

Illegal immigrants who bring these diseases into the country don't undergo an initial health screening required and may cross the border because they are ill just to take advantage of "free" healthcare.

Often, living in squalid, close-quarters they may pass their viruses on to co-workers, healthcare workers, and anyone they come in close contact with.

Others may be asymptomatic and unsuspectingly pass their disease on to others long before they show any illness themselves.

Just as troubling are the political bottlenecks that prevent new and effective antibiotics from entering the market.

**Arizona** has been hard hit with a virulent strain of this once-exotic-but-now-commonplace West Nile virus. Patients have been affected with seizures and nerve damage in some cases. Arizona citizens will pay a high cost in personal health consequences for the federal government's hostile and aggressive opposition to the state's commonsense attempts to curb illegal immigration.

**California** had an outbreak of typhoid fever in 2009 that affected 90 people. There were 400 cases reported during that year nationwide.

Historically, tens of thousands of Americans have died of typhoid fever, including some 81,000 Union soldiers and two First Ladies, Abigail Adams and Mary Todd Lincoln.

Typhoid has repeatedly evolved to become resistant to more and more antibiotics. There's no reason to believe that this evolution will not continue, enabling typhoid to reassert its historic role as a major public health threat. Globally, the disease still kills over 200,000 people annually.

In **Colorado**, people are at a higher risk of contracting Hantavirus than in other states. Hantavirus can lead to a deadly respiratory infection. It's spread through rodent waste. Most people get it by drinking from contaminated containers or by inhaling dust in buildings with rodent infestations.

**New Mexico** reported 75% of all cases of Bubonic Plague in 2009. While the U.S. only sees a handful of Bubonic Plague cases a year, it is still around.

**Texas** tops the list with approximately 150 cases of leprosy diagnosed each year! Travelers and illegal immigrants may be the primary carriers, but armadillos carry the bacterium that triggers the disease.

This growing phenomenon is not confined to the Border States. If you're planning on traveling, you'd be well advised to check which states have experienced recent break-out of exotic diseases. This list includes the five most populous states in the nation and accounts for better than 42% of the U.S. population.

**Delaware** tops the list for Lyme Disease cases, but you may come in contact with infected ticks throughout New England, down through Maryland and as far west as Minnesota.

**Florida:** In 2010, more than 66 cases of Dengue fever were reported in the Sunshine State. Dengue is transmitted by mosquitoes and until very recently was found most often in more tropical regions like India and the South Pacific.

**Illinois:** Certain insects typically found in South and Central America transmit Chagas disease. It infects you with a parasite that attacks your organs. It's difficult to diagnose because many of the symptoms mimic heart disease, and because most U.S. doctors have never seen it. Several confirmed cases of Chagas disease have been diagnosed in Illinois as well as California, Texas, Florida, New York, and many other states.

**New York:** When was the last time you heard of someone having the measles? How about mumps? Both diseases are on the rise in New York.

**Oklahoma** has nearly 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of 2000 annual cases of a disease most consider a thing of the past - Rocky Mountain spotted fever.

Statistically speaking, the chances of you ever contracting one of these rare or exotic diseases are no greater than being a victim of a suicide bomber or a plane crash; however, the odds against you are trending upward.

In most cases, using insect repellent and practicing good hygiene habits will keep you safe. In areas where West Nile Virus is prevalent, for example, it's prudent to wear bug spray and to keep your window and door screens in good repair.

In areas of high rodent populations pay particular attention to thoroughly washing your dishes. Under all circumstances avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth but keep your hands washed well. Take advantage of the hand-washing stations (using gel or pre-moistened towelettes) now posted at the entrances to most major retail centers. Wipe down not only your hands, but the handle of the shopping cart you are using.

To avoid infectious diseases like tuberculosis, try to avoid public transportation, crowded shopping centers, and hospital emergency rooms or other places where you're likely to come in contact with those carrying the disease, especially if you have compromised immunities or are susceptible to infection.

Finally, if you do come down with odd symptoms that don't go away after 72 hours, check in with your doctor or an urgent care center. Try to avoid hospital emergency rooms if you can.

Yes, we live in interesting times. The resurgence of many diseases we thought were a thing of the past is just one symptom of the disturbing trends we're seeing in many different sectors of society, and it serves as one more reminders that it pays to be ready for anything.
